

<p>James Chen</p>	<p>James Chen holds the Justin Smith Morrill Chair in Law at Michigan State University. He also serves as a visiting scholar at the Faculty of Economics and Business of the University of Zagreb, Croatia and as an adjunct faculty at Vermont Law School.</p> <p>In addition to his academic appointments, James is of counsel to the Technology Law Group, a Washington D.C. based firm specialising in telecommunications law. His teaching experience and scholarship span topics such as administrative law, antitrust, behavioural and mathematical finance, agricultural law, constitutional law, economic regulation, environmental economics, environmental law, legislation, natural resources law, remedies, and state and local taxation.</p> <p>James edits the series on "Quantitative Perspectives on Behavioural Economics and Finance" for Palgrave Macmillan and is the author of three books in that series, <i>Postmodern Portfolio Theory, Finance and the Behavioural Prospect</i>, and <i>Econophysics and Capital Asset Pricing</i>. A fourth book, <i>A Generalised Higher-Moment Capital Asset Pricing Model</i>, is forthcoming in 2018. He is also the co-author of <i>Disaster Law and Policy</i> (Aspen, 3d ed. 2016), the first book to address the legal issues surrounding natural disasters.</p> <p>James received his Bachelor of Arts (<i>summa cum laude</i>) and Master of Arts from Emory University, Atlanta, USA in 1987. During his undergraduate studies, he was elected to Phi Beta Kappa (the oldest academic honor society in the United States). After studying at Háskóli Íslands (the University of Iceland) as a Fulbright Scholar from 1987-88, he graduated <i>magna cum laude</i> from Harvard Law School in 1991. In addition to receiving his <i>juris doctor</i> from Harvard, he served as an executive editor of the <i>Harvard Law Review</i>. He served as a law clerk to the Honorable J. Michael Luttig, the United States Court of Appeals for the Fourth Circuit, and to the Honorable Clarence Thomas, Associate Justice of the Supreme Court of the United States.</p> <p>James is licensed to practice law in Virginia and the District of Columbia, USA. He serves on the board of editors for the <i>ACRN Oxford Journal of Finance and Risk Perspectives</i>, the <i>International Advances in Economic Research</i>, the <i>Zagreb International Review of Economics and Business</i>, and the <i>Journal of European Union Agrarian Law</i>. From 2010 to 2017 he served as a public member of the Administrative Conference of the United States (ACUS). Since 2017 he has been a senior fellow of ACUS. In 2006 he was elected to the American Law Institute.</p>
